Work experience opportunities

Work experience is a great way of helping you decide on the right path to advance your career. Depending on the stage you are at in your academic studies, we have two work experience options, which both provide you with a taste of the world of business and what life is like at EY.

We frequently offer people who perform well on our work experience programmes the opportunity to begin their career with us as trainees.

Skills Academy programme

Are you still at school, and not too sure about the idea of university?

- Our Skills Academy programme provides you with the opportunity to gain insight into the world of work and a better understanding of where your studies could take you.
- Our Skills Academy programme is designed for students studying any subject at Level 3 (A-Level, International Baccalaureate (IB) or equivalent). The week of paid work experience will involve learning about EY and gaining hands-on experience of working for our clients. You'll boost your career chances while learning what it's like working in a business.

Channel Islands Summer Internship programme

If you're studying at university you're eligible to apply to take part in our Channel Islands Summer Internship programme.

- It doesn't matter what you're studying as it's open to all Channel Islands degree students. The paid internship programme is for local undergraduates and is held annually during July.

- You'll complete a comprehensive induction, including team building activities. Then you'll be fully immersed into life at EY and you will join our assurance, tax and tech risk teams to begin doing the same kind of work as our graduates, working directly with clients. We aim to prepare you for a future in business; and provide you with a powerful sense of what your strengths are and how you can use them to reach your ambitions.

Trainee programmes for school leavers and graduates

Ready to start your career?

- EY is the perfect place to start your career and gain an understanding of finance and the world of business. We help some of the largest, most influential businesses worldwide navigate ever-changing markets, and the new technology that's driving them. Upon joining EY, you will begin studying towards a globally recognised professional qualification.

Accelerate training programme

- If you've finished school and aren't sure about university, jump straight in to the world of business on our three-year Accelerate training programme. It's specifically designed for school leavers as an alternative to university. You'll join us in September and begin studying ACCA as a professional qualification while learning on-the-job and earning a salary from day one. ICAEW may be studied subject to certain criteria. If you join our tax team you will have the additional option of studying the Association of Taxation Technicians (ATT) qualification.

Graduate training programme

- If you've finished university, or are about to, our three-year graduate training programme is a great way to apply your knowledge, learn new skills and start a rewarding career.
- It doesn't matter what you have studied in the past, as we employ graduates who have studied any subject – our teams thrive on the diverse experience our people bring. As a graduate trainee you will join us in September and choose to study ICAEW, ACCA, or if joining our tax team you will have the additional option of ATT as a professional qualification, while gaining skills and experience in professional services.

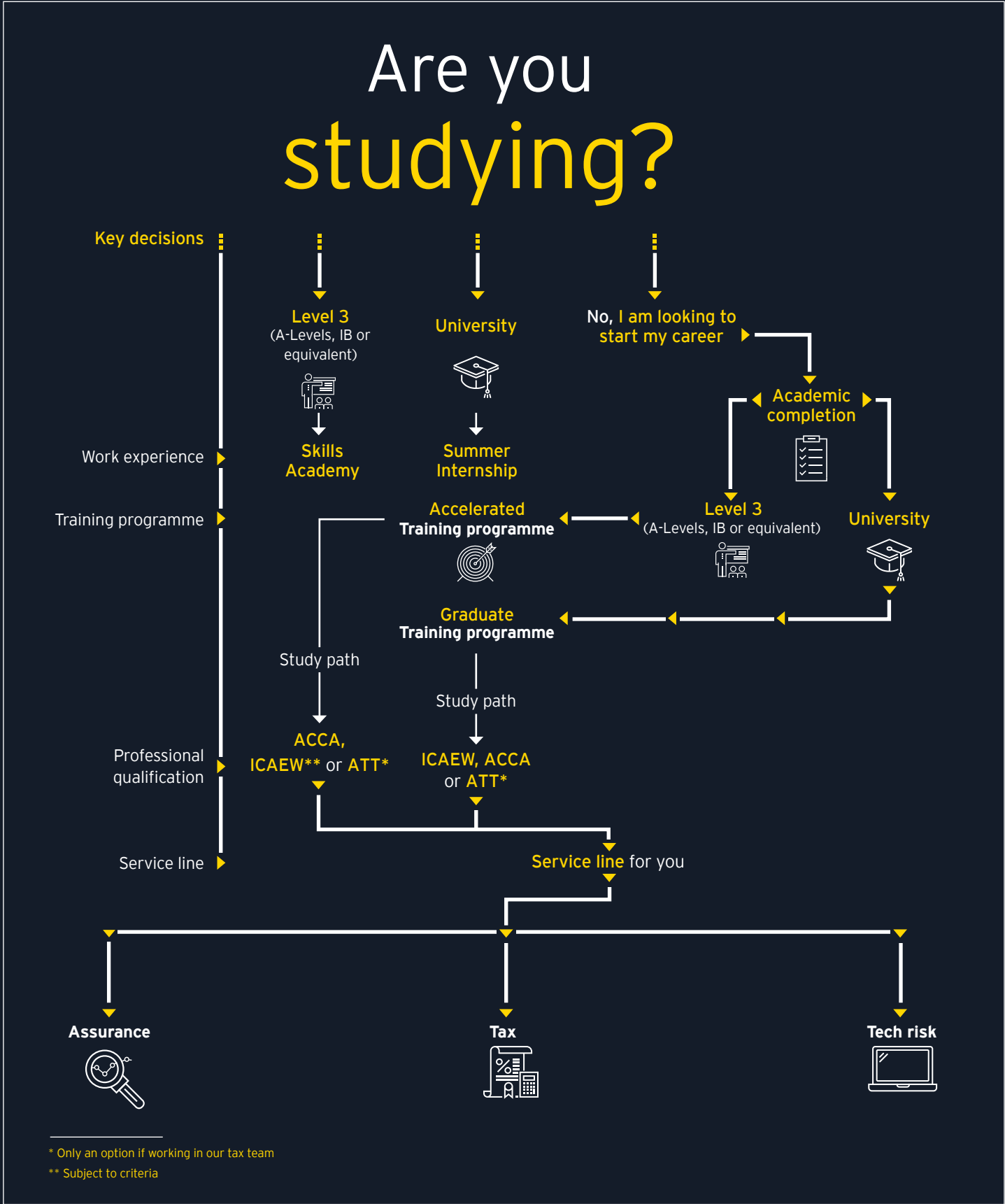
